Small Animal Tagging & Worksheet Deadline - Sunday, May 4th

Small Animal Tagging is Sunday, May 4th at the Leavenworth County Fairgrounds. You should receive your worksheets for all animals soon and an email with the link to the tagging sign-up will be sent out April 16th. Reminder: ALL worksheets are due on May 4th. You can scan and email, take a picture and email or text, mail (not recommended), drop it by the office or bring all your worksheets to tagging on Sunday, May 4th. NO worksheets will be accepted after Sunday, May 4th. Do not wait if you have questions.

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) Annual Training

All youth who are planning to exhibit livestock at the Leavenworth County Fair must take the annual Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) certification class. You can either take the class online at yqcaprogram.org or attend a in-person class. There are two in-person classes left in Leavenworth County. The two classses are April 17th and April 28th. Both classes will start check-in at 5:30 and class will begin at 6pm. They will be held at the Extension Office.

If you have already taken the class, please remember to log back in to your YQCA account and print your certificate. You will need to take a pre and post class survey in order to gain access to your YQCA certificate.

If you attend one of the three in-person classes that we offered, we do not need your certificate, just your number on your family identification worksheets that are due May 4th. If you took the class elsewhere or online, please submit a copy of your certificate to the office.

Deadline to complete YQCA training to exhibit livestock at the 2025 Leavenworth County Fair is June 30th.

Hydration- Learn how to stay hydrated while getting to choose from our "hydration station" that will be set up.


Skin Protection- Learn more about proper sunscreen application and the importance of skin protection. Activity provided.

Record Books

Why do we need to learn 4-H Record Keeping? The purpose of 4-H record keeping is a teach how to keep records, which is an important life skill. Record keeping is an ngoing process that does not end when the 4-H year ends. Youth are encouraged to elect from a variety of alternatives to meet their individual record keeping needs and earning styles.

1 4-H, using a record keeping system is a recommended practice for youth in grades 4-2 to track participation, goals, achievements, and reflections throughout your 4-H ourney. This record keeping system can be referred to when writing award pplications, resumes, scholarship applications, or preparing for meetings or speeches. Ou can find more information on our local website under 4-H Youth Development/Forms and Resources.



To learn how to set goals, how to make plans for action, and how to decide how well ou did (evaluation).

To learn the skills of record keeping and organization to use now and in the future.

To learn to communicate and summarize.

To learn responsibility by completing a task.

To evaluate information that will market personal skills through future resumes and pplication forms.

There is also a video located on the Youth Livestock page that can be very helpful.


Finally, it is a requirement for 4-H members to be enrolled and the enrollment fee must be paid in order to participate.

4-H Discovery Days


