FairEntry System Information

Register in FairEntry now until June 30th. You will access the FairEntry program through our website, leavenworth.ksu.edu, 4-H Youth Development, then 4-H Fairbook & Information or by going to fairentry.com. The system works with your 4-H Online Enrollment information. You will use your family account email and password to log in to FairEntry. *It is important to remember that only the projects that you enrolled in through 4honline will be available for fair entries.*

<u>IMPORTANT</u>: Complete entries for ALL 4-H members in your family BEFORE selecting the submit button. Entries may be adjusted in the account before the submit button is selected until June 30, but become final when the submit button is selected. There will be no changes made after June 30.

There is a \$2.00 fee per exhibitor, which can be paid online or at the Extension Office.

Building Exhibit Check-in

The below information applies to Building Exhibits only. This would include any project that is displayed in a building such as Photography, Foods, Visual Arts, Fiber Arts, Woodworking, Posters and Displays, Home Environment, Entomology, Energy Management, Cloverbuds, and Space Tech. Each 4-Her will pick up *only* the cards for the projects they are bringing to fair. The 4-Her will receive all of their Building Exhibit entry cards at one time instead of at each judging area. You still need to bring your projects to the designated areas where entries are accepted during the times listed on the 4-H Pre-Fair & Fair Week Activities. The below areas <u>are not a place to drop off projects</u>, only pick up entry cards. Please try to come to one of the times below to get entry cards. Staff will be available in the office to print cards as well but will not have as many resources as during the below times so it may take longer. Attention Livestock Exhibitors: Please be informed that no animals will be allowed to ship on Friday as they have in the past. Leavenworth County Fair Set-Up and Clean-Up

All 4-H families are responsible for helping set up the fair grounds for fair week and for helping clean up after fair is over. For fair set-up, everyone will meet in the show arena on Sunday and we will assign areas for all to set up. Clean-up will be a bit different. An area of the fairgrounds will be assigned to each club to make sure that everything gets taken care of. Please bring brooms, trash bags, or any other items you feel will help in the process. Each club will be required to assign two members (older teens or adults preferred) to the food stand to help with set-up. Please determine this prior to Sunday. 4-Hers will still need to meet in the show arena and then will be dismissed to the food stand. If you cannot make the scheduled time, please come when you can. There is plenty to do in order to get the fairgrounds "fair" ready!!

New 4-H Projects at Leavenworth County Fair 2019

Table Setting

(You do not have to be enrolled in Foods to participate.)

Table setting is a new project area this year. All supplies must be furnished and kept in order by the exhibitor. One-half of an 8-foot table will be provided for the 4-Her to set up. No food should be used. An individual place setting may include linens, dishes, silverware/utensils and center piece for one place setting only. Paper and plastic products are acceptable. You will set-up your table prior to judging, but will sit with judge, discuss your choices, menu, table theme, and answer questions the judge may have. Following judging all items will be left for public viewing during the fair week. Recycled Clothing Project

Recycled Clothing Project is part of the Clothing and Textiles project. You must be enrolled in Clothing and Textiles to participate. To qualify for the recycled clothing category, your item must be made of at least 50% recycled material (recycled means reusing an existing item in a new way). Could be remaking/ redesigning a garment, re-purposing a clothing item for a new use, etc. Must include sewing of some kind. A3"x5" index card MUST accompany entry describing the recycled materials and how they were used in the item. Early Judging for Forestry, Geology & Wildlife

We are going to try something new this year. 4-Hers who are enrolled in Forestry, Geology and Wildlife projects will participate in early judging. Please note that this is a trial run for us but due to low numbers in entries over the past few years and the challenge of getting qualified judges within these project areas, we feel it will be beneficial to participate in a regional judging event for these areas. A pre-fair entry form has been sent by email to those families enrolled in these projects. Again as a reminder, this does not • replace your entry through FairEntry, our online entry system. Pre-Entry Forms for these projects are • due to the Extension Office by June 21st and electric entries through FairEntry will follow the same dead-Ine as other projects, June 30th. Day of Judging will be July 8, 2019 in Holton, KS.

All entries must be made through local County Extension Offices and are due August 1.






